You are the wife of a wealthy lawyer. You live with your husband on a large estate, though he acquired ownership of any property you possessed after your marriage to him.

You are a free person of African descent. You were born into freedom and own some property and land, but many of your rights are restricted because of your skin color.

You are a German immigrant, recently arrived in North America. You work as a farmer in a community with other German-speaking people. Your community gets along with other nearby towns, but mostly keeps to itself.

You are an English officer in the British Army. You fought in the French and Indian War, gaining respect and notoriety for your contributions to Britain's victory. You command a small garrison of troops in North America.

You are an enslaved person of African descent. You were born into slavery and separated from your family through an auction. You are viewed as both property and a person within the British Empire and have very few rights.

You are a male farmhand. Your family left Scotland when you were a baby in search of a better life following a failed uprising against the King of England. You work in fields much of the day, but do not own any property. The work is hard, but you are paid well enough to make a living.

You are a wealthy widow living in the American colonies. Your late husband was a government administrator and many of your other family members have worked in some way or form for the British Government. Married women are not legally allowed to own property, but you legally inherited one third of your husband's property upon his death.

You are a member of the Mohawk Nation and veteran of the French and Indian War. You fought for the British, but know many others that sided with the French. You have watched your native lands carefully after King George III promised to prevent colonists from settling there.

You are a wealthy, male merchant. Your family left England to settle in North America several generations ago. You own several sloops that allow you to trade goods with Great Britain. In addition to this, you own an abundant amount of land.
