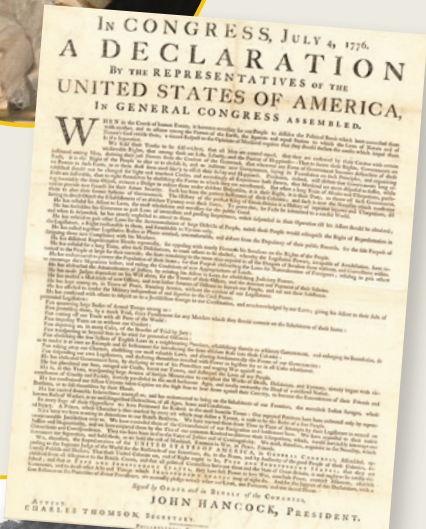

RESERVATION BASICS

- Tour Operator Rates: \$11 per student, \$16 per adult
Educator Facilitated Tours (Self-guided upon request)
1 complimentary adult chaperone for every 10 students
- **NEW FOR SY25-26:** Schools can choose to tour the main galleries (Through Their Eyes program) or the special exhibit, *The Declaration's Journey*.
- All visits include the feature film *Washington's War Tent*
- Open Daily, 10am - 5pm
Earliest Group Admission: 9:30am
Latest Group Admission: 3:30pm
- Group Minimum: 15 people
Group Maximum: 100 people every 30 minutes
- Suggested Length of Visit: 2 hours
- Lunch space can be reserved in advance with a non-refundable fee of \$20.

Boxed lunches are available through the Museum's on-site caterer, RHC. Scan the code to the right for more information.
- Final head count and payment in full are due 30 days prior to the scheduled visit, but can be changed up to 14 days out without penalty.
- Visits may be cancelled at the last minute and refunded in full due to a weather-related event or a city-, State-, or nation-wide emergency that causes the Museum to close or makes it impossible for the group to visit.

WHEN YOUR GROUPS ARRIVE

- Please arrive 10 minutes prior to the scheduled admission time. If the group is late, it is at the Museum's discretion to modify or cancel your reservation. Refunds are not issued for late arrivals.
- Buses are welcome to drop off and pick up in the bus zone located in front of the Museum.
- Upon arrival, please send the group leader to the admissions desk to check in the group.

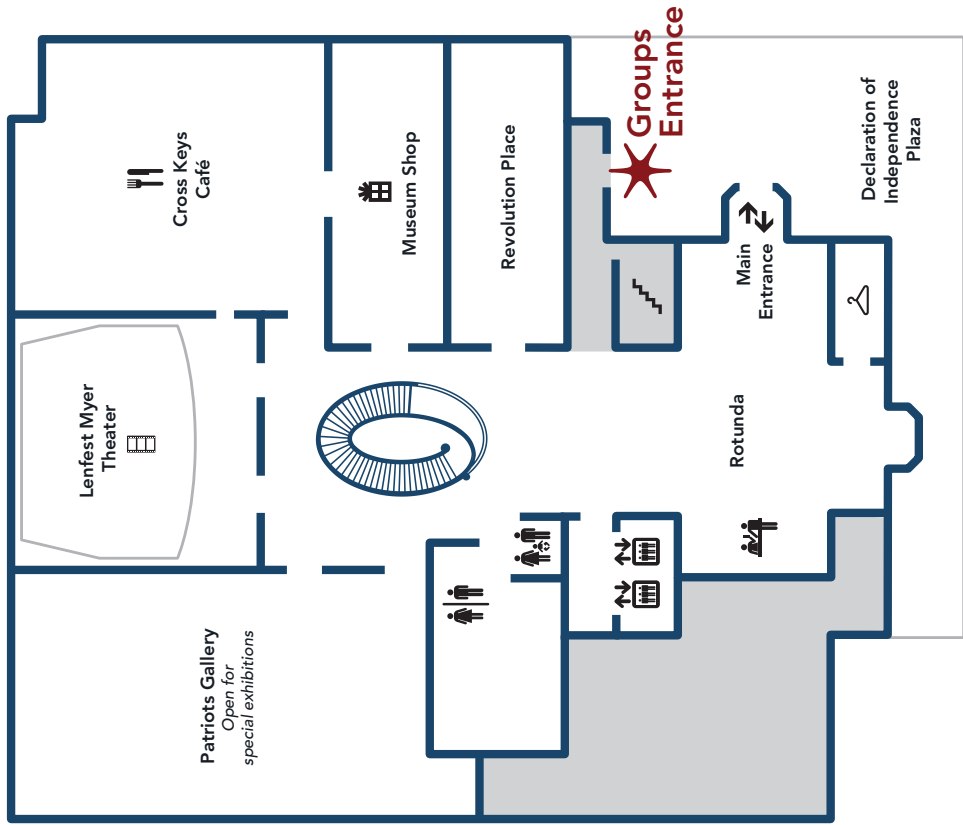

- The Museum shop is currently open during Museum operating hours.



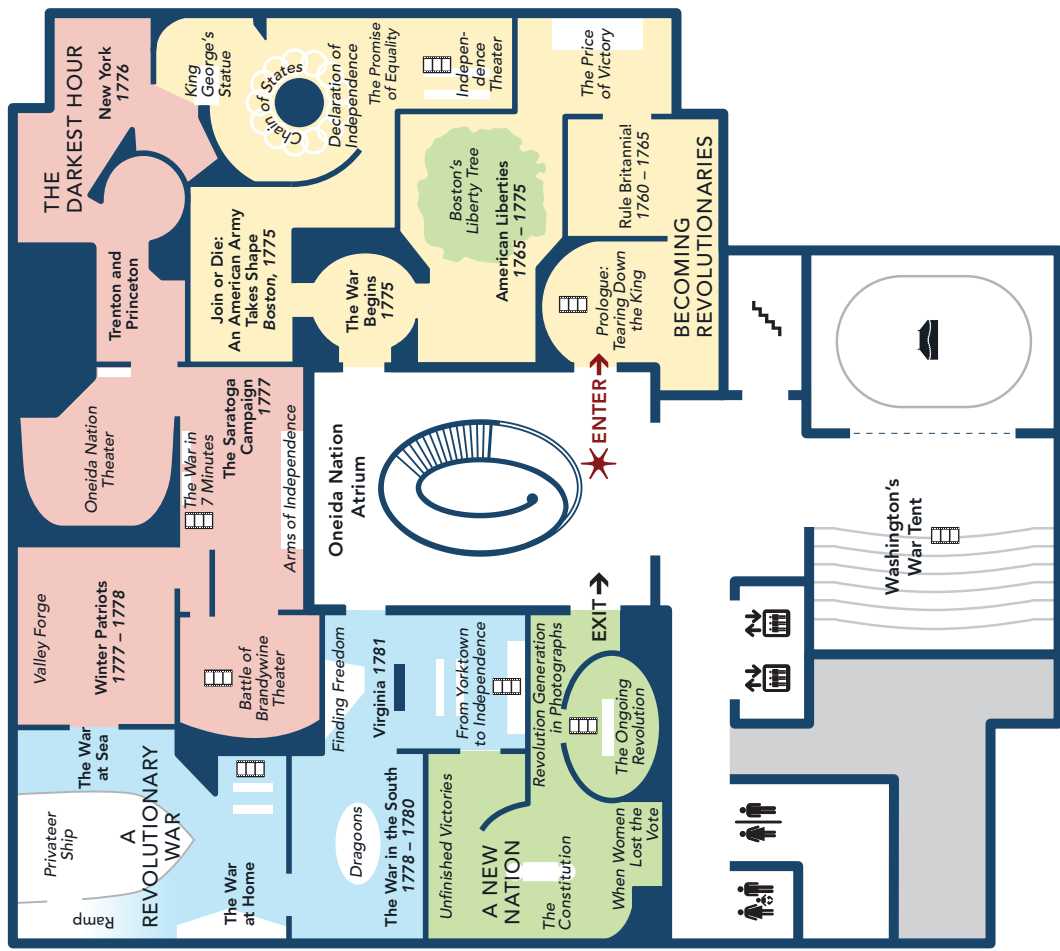
FLOOR PLAN
