Sir

We are just arrivd at Eastown Where we found about the Same Number of Indins we expected and Tolerably well disposd, tho Much in want of almost every Necessary one article In Particular Vizt about Twenty fifteen Camp Kettles not of the largest Size the Bearer of this Comes express with Two Horses On purpose to bring them up Please to let my Howel Dispatch him Immediately as it will be absolutely Necessary they should be here before we make a Distribution of the goods, we this morning heard by a [illegible] from head quarters which he Left Two Days ago that Forts Indepandance and Washington are Realy Taken If you have anything Now Pray Send it
