Bucks Countey October<sup>th</sup> 7 1777

My D<sup>r</sup> Rebecah this comes with love to you and my sweet Children nanse gives me a grate dale of truble to hear that she continues so very poorly we had a very hot ingagement it began a Saterdag at 6 in the morning and to the after noon in [illegible] Cpt Cox and Hugh Merica was kiled Mr lindenburgh<sup>h</sup> was wonded through the shoulder but not deadly We are all in good health thank god for it in the first Sckrimage we [illegible] at the white Horse I was not very well but was not hurt I left the compeney and staid in a house 2 days in that I got very well and has been since I Sent my Stock and buckel and nee buckels by Mr leman as the was likely to be lost out of my pocket pleas Remember me to nancey Shipburd and and all friends to more at present but Remain as before your Affecsonat loving husband to deat
